## THOUGHT FOR THE MONTH. From our Rector, the Revd. David Wintle

I am writing this before the result of the European elections is known; I am writing it the day before the vote, but I don't think the result will make any difference to what I am writing. I think I could have written pretty much the same thing any time from early 2016 onwards.

Wouldn't it be great to be clear about which way history is going, and for it to be the way we want it to be going, so we could be glad about it, instead of angry, or confused, or fed up?

The American President in the 1860s, during the American Civil War, was Abraham Lincoln. He was once asked if he thought God was on the side of the North, the Union, his side. He

answered:

'My concern is not whether God is on our side; my greatest concern is to be on God's side, for God is always right.'  $\rightarrow$ >>

He might have added that God always wins in the end. Could it be that we've got so tangled up in Brexit, so determined to be proven right, and so exercised by whether our side will win, that we've forgotten what really matters?

How would you know if you've got your priorities wrong? Well, do your friends know your views on Brexit, but not on Christ? Do they know whether you love Rees-Mogg, May or Corbyn, but not that you love Jesus? What do you talk about? What do you get passionate about? Whose victory do you care most about: Leave, Remain, or God?

Well, if you're a Christian, you're a Christian before you're a Leaver or a Remainer, or a Don't-Know-Anymore-But-Please-Get-On-With-It-er.

Then Moses stood
in the gate of the camp, and said,
Who is on the Lord's side?
let him come unto me.
And all the sons of Levi gathered
themselves together unto him.
Exodus 32:26


If you're a Christian, you are already on the right side, because you're on God's side.
