

Annual Parish Meetings/Annual Parochial Church Meetings

These two meetings – which are so close together that they feel like one meeting – will take place this year at the times above. Both meetings are open to anyone who wishes to attend, though there are restrictions on who may vote.

The Annual Parish Meeting is for the election of Churchwardens, and anyone on the civil electoral roll who lives in the respective parishes may vote.

The Annual Parochial Church Meeting receives reports on the life of the church and hears any questions which you may have about your parish churches. It also elects members to the PCC, and anyone who is on the church electoral roll may vote.

Please consider carefully if you are able to offer to serve on the PCC (Parochial Church Council) of your parish church

New ideas, new enthusiasm and new energy are always needed to ensure the vitality of your Parish Church into the future.

This is especially important as we approach the period after our Rector retires on April 30.


Your Churchyard: a place for peace and reflection.

Children in Church.

We love having children in our churches, and there is always provision for them at our 9.30 a.m. services at St. Leonard's Church, Ryton. All families with babies and children are sure of a warm welcome whenever they can join us. Families from

Bubbenhall are especially welcome.
All Ryton Sunday morning services start at 9.30 a.m., and the pattern is:

2nd Sunday in every month: Village Worship.

The most informal of all our services. We start in the Church Centre (warm and welcoming) with workshop activities for children, and coffee, puzzles and chat for grown ups to get to know one another.

At about 10.00 we move into church for a short and child-centred service. There is no need to be there on the dot of 9.30- people drift in as soon as they can make it.

4th Sunday in every month: Family Service.

An all-age service of readings, songs and activities with everybody young and old in church together. Children always participate in the readings/ drama sketches etc. and several people bring instruments to accompany the songs. (and any other musicians among you and your children would be very welcome to join them) Tea/coffee and cake after the service in the Church Centre.

Ist and 3rd Sundays in every month: Parish Communion with Sunday School.

Tea/coffee and the chance to socialise after every service. Children start the service in church with their parents, and after the first hymn go out for Sunday School activities in the Church Centre, returning to receive a blessing at the time of Communion. Parents are welcome to accompany their little ones to

Sunday School and stay with them if they lack confidence at first.

At these services, we also have a small but dedicated robed choir. We would love to recruit some additional membersperhaps you or members of you family, including children? Contact Ba on 02476 304295 - you will be most welcome!



A little bit about


St John the Baptist is warm and welcoming and has a reputation for being a friendly and co-operative community. We have a Sunday School at our Village Service and special festivals, and there is a children's quiet play area. A choir sings at all of our Sunday services and on special

St Giles was the subject of a BBC documentary in the year of the Millenium when the bells were recast, re-hung and augmented. At the same time a disabled access was created to the rear of the church with toilet and kitchen facilities: the base of the tower was refurbished and a children's area created. The church is a great venue for musical concerts.

St Leonard's has a Sunday School or activities for children at all our Sunday morning services. There is a choir that sings at Parish Communions. We have 8 bells and a team of bell ringers who practice every Monday. The Church Centre has a fully equipped kitchen that is frequently used for social events.

Thought for the Month: I felt at peace.

Andrew (not his real name, but his story is real) discovered that attending church helped his mental health.

"Last Sunday, after a particularly difficult week, I made the decision to go to church. Something I haven't done in a long while. With the strain of exams and the busy,



stressful schedule of adult life, my faith has declined over the years, with that one-hour trip to church every week becoming more and more of a rarity. But last Sunday, it was all becoming too much: the screens, the scrolling, the drama and the stress began to overwhelm me.

"So, I went to church. It seemed a simple decision at the time, but that one hour of solemnity and singing transformed my day and gave me a chance to reflect. Simply taking some time in absolute serenity to reflect on my life, on my place in the world, was a complete pleasure. I loved it.

"Recently my life has become a collage of endless screens; TV, music and football blare incessantly every hour of every day, and although I enjoy them, the unremitting crashing and clanging in my ears was beginning to become too much. My hour in church helped me realise how chaotic and stale my life has become; it allowed me to centre myself and for the first time in a long time I felt at peace with myself, liberated from the endless screaming of anxiety and insecurity.

"From a recent LSE study of 9000 Europeans, the epidemiologist Dr. Mauricio Avendano concluded: "The Church appears to play a very important role in keeping depression at bay, and also as a coping mechanism during periods of illness, providing "sustained happiness"

"Therefore, I would say that, if you're ever having a difficult time, if you're stressed or frenzied or anxious, just give church a try."
