



Footpaths in Bubbenhall

No more wobbly stiles! On two Sunday mornings (18 April and 20 June) I joined the Kenilworth Footpath Preservation Group (KFPG), and we carried out extensive maintenance work on Bubbenhall footpaths. You can see the results of our labours in all parts of the parish. We built new stiles at Old House Farm and Gravelly Knob and improved stiles and renewed waymarking at Quarryfield, Weston Lane, Riverside, The Slades, Broomhill Farm, Bubbenhall Wood and Waverley Edge.

KFPG collaborates with the county's Recreation and Countryside department in maintaining and improving rights of way in the Kenilworth area, organising work parties once a month. The county provide materials and equipment while the Group donate their skills voluntarily. The KFPG recently got an award from the Ramblers' Association for 'outstanding work on public rights of way and in particular a significant improvement in the state of local paths and their close liaison with the highway authority'.







Competition wines for the Autumn Flower and Vegetable Show

These wines are ideal for the beginner who has never made homemade wine before, as they use easy to obtain ingredients.

If you need any help then please contact me or Tony on 024 7663 9045 or e-mail tc_bubbenhall@btopenworld.com. I have a few spare demijohns and can supply some of the additives if anyone needs them.

Ribena or Blackcurrant Wine

- Ribena or blackcurrant juice
- o 3lb/1.4kg sugar
- o 1 tsp/5g citric acid
- 1tsp/5g yeast nutrient
- 1tsp/5g all-purpose yeast

Put the sugar and blackcurrant juice in a large saucepan with 3 pints/1.5 litres of water, bring to the boil and simmer for ten minutes to o 1 tsp/5g all-purpose yeast made drive off any preservative in the juice.

Allow to cool, then pour through a funnel into a demijohn and top up to the shoulder with cold water. Put in the yeast and other additives and fit an airlock. Leave in a warm place for fermentation to take place.

After two weeks or so, when the initial fermentation has died down a little, top up with cold water to the bottom of the neck of the jar, replace the airlock. Then continue the fermentation until it has ended.

Rack the wine, and add a crushed campden tablet, then bottle the wine when it is clear and stable. Sweeten if necessary using a non-fermenting sweetener such as Vinsweet or Canderel.

There is a slight risk that the colour may fade, so as a precaution use either a dark glass demijohn or wrap around with brown paper.

Bottle

Orange & Apple Wine

To make 1 gallon/4.5 litres of wine: To make 1 gallon/4.5 litres of wine:

- ∘ 1 x 12fl.oz/300 ml bottle of ∘ Avoid fruit juices that contain any preservatives
 - o 4pts/2litres natural orange juice
 - o 2pts/1 litre natural apple juice
 - o 1.5lb/675g sugar, boiled with 1pt/0.5 litre water
 - o 1 tsp/5g citric acid
 - o 1 tsp/5g grape tannin
 - 1 tsp/5 g yeast nutrient
 - into a starter bottle

Pour the juices in to a demijohn with the sugar syrup and other additives. Fit an airlock and after twelve hours add the pre-started yeast. Top up with water to the shoulder of the jar, refit the airlock and leave the wine in the warm to ferment. Shake daily to encourage fermentation.

When fermentation has finished place the demijohn in the cool, where it will settle and clear very quickly. Rack as soon as a sediment has formed and add a crushed campden tablet. Rack twice more, as and when needed. but do not add any more campden tablets. Top up each time with apple juice.

NEIGHBOUR-HOOD WATCH

Thieves are now targeting the boots of cars, as they know valuables may be hidden from view and will gain entry by smashing or removing the back seat.

As the holiday season is now underway and if you have a burglar alarm fitted to your property make sure a friend or neighbour is a key holder.

In the event of a false alarm the system can be checked and reset by a key holder and not cause a nuisance to neighbours.

If you are going to be away and would like a neighbourhood watch co ordinator to keep an eye on your property please feel free to contact me and I can pass details on to your local co ordinator.

If you have any concerns or suspicions of any kind please remember to get a description of any strange person or a vehicle registration to help police with any enquiries.

It is only with the help of everyone in the village that we can try to keep the crime rate down.
