# Parish Council

#### **Emergency Planning**

Mick Potter of the WCC Emergency Planning Unit attended the Parish Council meeting on December 11th to speak about planning for emergencies. The village Emergency Committee had held a meeting prior to this and Mr Potter was able to answer some of their queries.

#### Conservation Area Review

Alan Mayes, Conservation Officer from WDC, also attended our meeting on 11th December to outline a proposed review of the conservation area in the village. The purpose of this extension is to give extra protection to areas within the village which are considered to be aesthetically worthy.

#### The areas concerned are:

- 1. Corner of Coopers Walk and Lower End, to include New House and Fir Tree House. The residents of these properties are against the proposal and we concurred with their view. We have notified the Conservation Officer that we consider the listing of Abbey's House to be sufficient.
- 2. Church Road extension to include more of some back gardens. As this will have little impact on the village,

we have asked residents to liaise directly with the Conservation Officer.. 3. Old School and adjoining property inclusion agreed.

#### The Spout.

Checks carried out by Mr Dennis O'Brien have shown that the flow of water to the spout is steadily reducing. The reason for this became clear at a meeting with Smiths Concrete at the end of January when we were advised that an independent hydrologist has established that the aquifers which fed the spring are no longer in existence. We have also been advised that Mr O'Brien's suggestion that a holding lake be established with a feed to the spout is unworkable and because of contamination issues, neither the Parish council nor Smiths concrete wish to see a circulatory system in operation. We would be interested to hear from any villager who has any suggestions as to how we may re-establish or re-create a flow Policing.

The council receives regular reports from the Neighbourhood Watch Co-ordinator, Bob Gardner, and the Community Beat Officer, PC Owen King. PC King attended the meeting of the Parish council on 8th January. He

is confident that policing is getting better in that beat officers were not dealing with as much crime related paperwork and had more time for patrols, computer systems are being improved and email addresses will be given to the Clerk when available. Voice mail should also return soon. It was suggested that PC King attend the village hall once a month during the Doctor's surgery times so that villagers may raise any crime connected issues with him, this is being considered. It is hoped that all 999 calls should now be correctly routed as local postcodes have been given to BT. We will wait and see!

The council has considered the possibility of installing CCTV in the village, but it seems unlikely that any external funding will be available as in the eyes of the police, the level of crime does not appear to warrant this **Three Horseshoes.** 

The council has received a copy of a planning application to alter the premises to include the provision of seven bedrooms. Concern was raised that this was a substantial development in the heart of the village in close proximity to neighbouring properties. A site meeting was arranged between the Parish Council, neighbours and the architect where the concerns of all parties were voiced. We are now awaiting feedback from the Planning Department.

## Budget for the Parish Council 2002/2003.

The Budget has been agreed and forwarded to Warwick District Council. The precept remains the same as the current year at £6500.

#### The Spout Garden

improving the area adjacent to the spout. A meeting was held on 27th January between members of the Parish Council and local residents. Since that meeting, however, it has been established that only the green in the centre of the area actually belongs to the Parish Council. Investigations are now going on to determine ownership and to obtain sanction for improvements.



# St. Giles Church

I am having to take quite a long view in writing this, because I am writing it in the middle of February, just as Lent is starting, and by the time the next Newsletter after this comes out, a lot of things will have happened.

First of all, Mothering Sunday - there will be Holy Communion at 11am on 10 March, and posies will be blessed and handed out to all the children (and any grown-ups who want one). We have a special preacher on that day, Mrs. Jan Craven, a volunteer worker with the Children's Society, and she will be talking about the work of the Children's Society.

Palm Sunday is on 24 March, and again there will be a celebration of Holy Communion at 11am on that day.

Please come and join us.

And now one very important advanced notice: on 19 May, the parish of St. John the Baptist, Baginton will formally be joining

St. Giles and St. Leonard, Ryton, and from then on we will be three parishes with one priest in charge. I hope we will be able to make the congregation of St. John the Baptist and the people of Baginton feel welcome, and join happily and enthusiastically with them in prayer, worship and mission, to encourage and help each other and to meet for social events. This does mean, of course, that I will be spread more thinly, but, for six months at least after we join together, and for longer if it seems like a good idea to all concerned, we shall be maintaining the existing pattern of services at St. Giles.

### Alan Rowland Gibson,

Burma Star 1923-2001

Mourners from many walks of life gathered together at St Giles Church, Bubbenhall on Thursday 3rd January to pay their respects to Alan Gibson who died suddenly on December 24th aged 78. Alan had lived in Bubbenhall for the past twenty years and since his arrival had become a hugely respected and well loved figure as both the chairman of the Village Hall Committee, a post which he held until his death, and previously as Vice Chairman of the Parish Council.

Alan was educated at Old Merchant Taylors School and Imperial College, London, but war interrupted his University studies and he was commissioned in the army in 1941. He attained the rank of Colonel in the Royal Horse Artillery. After initial training in Scotland, he was posted at short notice to Burma. After his arrival, he joined the special Chindits

volunteer force established to fight behind enemy lines.

Alan was captured by the Japanese in 1943 and interned under dreadful conditions for almost three years. Although a naturally tall and imposing person, his weight dropped to less than six stone. He readily acknowledged that he was fortunate to survive the experience when so many of his fellow prisoners died. Having entered the camp as the youngest officer he was the senior surviving officer when it was relieved in 1945. In that capacity he accepted the surrender of the Japanese camp commander and often described his elation when the Black Watch marched into the camp in full uniform.

After hospitalisation in Singapore, he saw post-war service as a commanding officer in Calcutta working on "operation hunger" to feed the Indian population and in Languard Fort, Felixstowe, including a period with Field Marshall Montgomery.

The largest part of his civilian working life was committed to Laughtons and Sons - an old established Birmingham metal-wares company. He became the Works Manager there in 1962 and retired from the company in 1988. Former colleagues speak of his almost instinctive talents as a manager. He was easy to talk to, ready to listen seriously to even the most junior employee, and had few hang-ups about status, seniority or hierarchy. Above all, his success as a manager is attributed to his fastidious attention to the detail of even complex new engineering projects, and his concern for the safety and well-being of staff. Retirement did not suit him and he worked part-time for several more years as the administrator of the Warwick Research Institute at the University of Warwick.

He moved to Bubbenhall in 1982 and married Margaret his surviving spouse in 1987. His potential for leadership was spotted early on and he was persuaded to become the Chairman of the Reading Room Continued page 3 column 1....

Committee, taking on this decaying Victorian legacy along with a bank balance of £244. Alan immediately informed the Committee that they would fund and build a new Village Hall for Bubbenhall within three years. Despite their initial scepticism Alan pulled everyone together and the new village hall was built and formally opened in 1987. Alan continued to run the operation with military precision and efficiency and almost single-handedly raised tens of thousands of pounds for the village with projects including a major extension to the hall, a multi surface playing court, emergency heating and cooking facilities and most recently additional car parking facilities. He once said that his Chindits training prepared him well for the perils of village politics!

In his youth Alan played Rugby to a high standard. He played fly half for several years for Harlequins, and also had games for the Barbarians. After his army service he committed himself with his usual energy to cricket playing for his work's team. For many years he played golf at Fulford Heath Golf Club, Birmingham where he played off a single digit handicap. Later he became a member of Kenilworth Golf Club where he was well known as Chairman of Eggs (The Senior Section), a post he relinquished only a few months ago. He was still playing off a handicap of 22 a few weeks before his death.

Alan was greatly respected in both his professional and his community life as a natural leader, the man who would always go the extra mile for family, colleagues and friends even when he himself was busy. He was an inspiration to anyone who wanted to get things done!

Alan is survived by his beloved wife Margaret, by his children Mark and Roger, by his step-children Vicky, Alex, and Kingsley, and also by his daughter-in-law Anne, grandchildren Emma and Jade and great-grand daughter Leah.


