Village Hall Vandalism


It is with great regret we report that the village hall has become a target for petty but destructive and costly vandalism.

Parish Council


Affordable Housing

At the December Parish Council meeting, the Clerk reported that on 22nd November 2011 a Housing Strategy Officer from WDC called to discuss the queries the Parish Council/Village had proposed housing.

The Officer confirmed that while the District Council would be willing to look at changing the design of the maisonettes they would consider changing them to houses as they would then not fit the 'need' found by the original Housing Needs Survey. The sewer concerns, the Housing Officer said, had been passed to Severn Trent.

The Chair summarised:

- there has been a lack of understanding from the village regarding the term 'Affordable Housing'
- the current infrastructure has been declared satisfactory, however no-one has been willing/able to look into the Village's concerns regarding current problems of drainage, sewers, parking, etc



- types of proposal/suitability villagers are opposed to the erection of maisonettes rather than houses in a rural setting, and with no accommodation for growing families
- once original tenants with links to Bubbenhall have moved on, the properties will be opened up to all on the WDC housing register and not just those with links to the village
- there is major concern regarding further commercial development once the Green Belt field is built on.

After further consultation with WDC, the Parish Council unanimously agreed to reject the WRCC recommendation that they support the proposed development.

Neighbourhood Watch

PCSO Jackie Pimlott attended the meeting on 6th March 2012 to give advice to the Neighbourhood Watch Committee. PCSO Pimlott discussed the different methods of spreading news to Neighbourhood

Watch members and villagers, but also made clear that care must be taken not to overly worry elderly residents.

Given the recent vandalism of the Village Hall by older children in the Village, PCSO Pimlott offered to send a police car to the Village Hall during the times at which the vandalism is occurring, up to 4 nights during the week. The Parish Council and residents thought this an excellent idea.

The NW Committee has a bank account with £50, suggestions were made that it could be used to buy smart water. PSCO Pimlott also stated she is able to provide NW stickers.

The Chair expressed hope that the NW would become a pro-active group. Cllr Haynes agreed to convene a neighbourhood watch meeting to organise a lead coordinator for the group. PSCO Pimlott offered to attend that

meeting also. The Chair thanked PCSO Pimlott for attending the meeting.

Drainage

Paddy Rudd, Warwickshire Network Manager and Gaynor Jerzyszek from Severn Trent Water attended the meeting on 6th March to discuss drainage issues in the Village. They were informed that the Village had problems in Spring Hill, Lower End and the main cause for concern, Lower End.

Villagers expressed dismay regarding the recent Affordable Housing issues when Severn Trent stated that the current infrastructure was sufficient to deal with additional houses, when it cannot cope currently.

Villagers took the opportunity to advise the representatives from STW where the problems are and also marked them on a map. Paddy Rudd stated that if problems are found, it may take time to resolve and possibly cause disruption to roads.

Cllr Doody asked about funding, Gaynor Jerzyszek stated that 5 year plans were in place and that it may be possible to approach the Environment Agency for additional funds, however if the network is failing it would be up to Severn Trent to fund.

The Clerk will arrange a meeting with Paddy and residents to visit locations of concern before the next meeting and to also send details of previous contact with Severn Trent to Paddy. The Chair thanked Paddy and Gaynor for attending the meeting.

Vacancies on Parish Council

The Parish Council currently has two vacancies after Cllr Gill Green resigned in December and also Cllr Aldo Keates who stepped down on 6th March, Aldo will be moving to France later this month. Both Councillors will be missed. Two

villagers have indicated an interest in joining the Parish Council.

Emergency Committee

It has been agreed that Cllr Haynes and Cllr Morrison and also one other member of the village will join the Committee, which is chaired by Tony Cox. The first role of the new committee will be to update the Emergency Plan. The Chair emphasised the need for the list of vulnerable people to be up-to-date.

Coventry Airport

Cllr Doody reported that various plans for development of the airport site are under consideration.

HS₂

Following the announcement that the Cabinet has agreed to go ahead with HS2 scheme, the route has been altered slightly and it will take a different route through the Stoneleigh Showground. The 51M group (of which WDC is a member) is pressing

for a judicial review after it has been reported that 90% of responses received during the consultation period were against HS2.

Liaison Committee

Smiths Concrete has provided advance notices of the application they intend to make in the Spring to quarry Wolston Fields Farm and thereby to extend the working life of the Bubbenhall processing plant. At the Liaison Committee meeting on 10th January the Parish Council were told 4 lorries an hour will transport sand and gravel from Wolston to the Bubbenhall quarry for processing (making 8 in total back and forth). An exhibition took place in Wolston in January of Smiths proposals.

Recreation Ground

Cllrs Keates, Morrison & Haynes have presented a report to the Parish Council on possible options for the BMX track area. Their research found there is no desire for refurbishment of

BMX track amongst children in the Village. Children would ideally like: a skate park, a shelter, CCTV, multisports area with goal posts and more challenging/adventurous play equipment, access to toilets.

The skate park, youth shelter and multi-sports equipment were the top 3; Cllr Haynes stated a sum of $\mathfrak{L}35,000$ would be required to complete the work. However he suggested this could be a 5-6 year project, with time to look into funding, grants and possible sponsorship.

The Chair thanked Cllr Keates for all his hard work regarding the recreation ground. Cllr Baker will take on the role of overseeing the recreation ground. The delivery and installation of a new bench (kindly donated) and picnic tables to the recreation ground is expected imminently.

Precept

The Parish Council budget for 2012-13 was discussed and it was agreed the precept for the next financial year should be £10,000.

Planning

Recent applications include:

- 5 Home Close erection of single storey extension to front porch.
 Permission has been granted; the Parish Council had no objections to this application.
- Watery Meadow, Bubbenhall Road - erection of field shelter and hay store and change of use from recreational use to agricultural use including livestock and horses. The Parish Council had no objections, although concern was expressed about implications on converting recreational land to agricultural land.
- Longfields, Spring Hill erection of single storey rear extension, balcony and new first floor doors.
 Permission has been granted; the Parish Council had no objections to this application.
- Shrubs Lodge, Pagets Lane construction of a menage including floodlights - concern has been expressed regarding light pollution from the floodlights.

Diamond Jubilee

Cllr Baker suggested the Village celebrate the Diamond Jubilee as part of the Fete and Fun day on 16th June as it was likely lots of families will be away on the official date (4th June) as this is during half-term week.

The children's tea party will take place after the main events at the Fete, either in the tennis court or Village Hall (weather depending). The BVE Committee has kindly donated funds for an entertainer and parents will supply food. The Parish Council has agreed to provide commemorative mugs for

children of Bubbenhall aged 0-16. Residents will also be able to buy a mug, approximate cost will be £4.

Parish Plan

The two active groups in the Village, BVE and the Village Hall Committee have been contacted regarding the development of a Parish Plan and positive responses received. The Clerk and Cllrs Baker and Haynes will be attending a CPRE planning course on 24th March 2012 where it is hoped further information will be obtained.

It has come to our attention that dog fouling appears to be on the increase in Bubbenhall, particularly on the verandah at the Village Hall.

Dog fouling is unsociable and unhealthy, if it's your dog it's your responsibility. Dog litter is harmful to human health. It can contain Toxocara an infection that if swallowed, for example by young children putting their finger into their mouths, can penetrate the intestine, liver and other tissues such as the lungs and eyes and can cause blindness in some

cases.

The majority of dog owners in Bubbenhall do recognise their responsibilities, however there is a minority who do not, please help us tackle this by reporting dog fouling by calling Warwick District Council on 01926 412464 and ask to speak to a member of the Street Scene team.

The Council will act upon anyone who lets their dog foul and fails to





BRINGING SUPERFAST BROADBAND TO OUR RURAL AREAS

Last year the Government announced that £530m was be made available for the provision of superfast broadband (min 24Mbps) to 90% of properties in the UK and that a minimum speed of 2Mbps should be available to 100% of properties.

£4.07m of this funding is available for Coventry, Solihull and Warwickshire for the roll-out of improved broadband, although there is a requirement that this amount should be match-funded from Local Authority capital funds.

Warwickshire County Council is leading the project to improve the broadband across the sub-region and we need your help.

Internet suppliers will only invest in building broadband infrastructure if they can guarantee sufficient demand for a good return on investment. This is why urban areas receive the best internet connectivity and why public funds are required to assist with the large investments needed to reach our rural areas.

Even so, the telecoms providers who will tender for the work will have to invest significantly more than the public subsidy to build the infrastructure and they will only do this in areas that are able to demonstrate the greatest demand.

Broadband in **Bubbenhall**

As I am sure you are already well aware, the quality of the broadband service in the village is pretty poor. Our local MP informed me that a grant of £4 million has been given to the local authority to improve broadband in the areas not being upgraded to fibre optic by BT.

I have been talking to Leigh Hunt (from Warwickshire County Council) who is responsible for administering this grant, and she has clarified the situation:

- 1. The £4 million is to be split between Coventry, Solihull and Warwickshire (with Warwickshire getting £3 million).
- 2. They will not get a penny unless the relevant local authorities match the grant.

3. The combined sum (£6 million for Warwickshire) will still not be enough to upgrade all those areas that require it.

In light of point 3 above, what she will have to do is to find suitable subcontractors to do the upgrade who will also be willing to part fund the project. In order for them to be convinced that this will be a worthwhile investment, they will need to know that there would be sufficient future business to justify it.

To this end I would urge you to go to the county website http://www.warwickshire.gov.uk/superfastbroadband and fill in the survey (click on the link in the right hand panel about 6 inches down), for either personal or business.

Let them know that Bubbenhall will be the right place to invest in an upgrade!


