The potential damage to the environment clearly demonstrated by the loss of biodiversity, the adverse impact on heritage assets, the noise, the pollution and the contamination have all been avoided.

However, Warwick District Council's emerging Local Plan proposes to remove this area of land from the Green Belt and allocate it for employment use. This would remove the presumption that development in the countryside is intrinsically inappropriate and replace it with a presumption in favour of development. The Community Group will continue to oppose this proposal. The fight to protect our rural communities continues.

Mark Symes: I am delighted by the decision to refuse the Gateway application. Thank you to all those thousands of people who supported the campaign. Those that delivered leaflets, wrote letters of objection, turned out at the meetings and contributed to the evidence and hearings in the planning meetings and the Public Inquiry, Well done one and all!



By marking your tack and equipment you are identifying the items as YOUR property. This helps to deter criminals from stealing the items as it is security marked and therefore harder to sell on and it provides the police with a means to return it to you if items are stolen. Stamping your leather goods is the simplest and the most effective way of identification.

He earned great respect from the opposition at these Planning Inquiries for his gentlemanly, measured, but ultimately incisive behaviour, and successfully managed to garner willing and active support for our case from councillors of the other main political parties.

At this very sad time our thoughts are therefore with Val, his two daughters, son, and five grandchildren. We shall all miss Bertie's presence, in local government life in particular, but the many who worked directly with him will miss him very much indeed.

Bertie MacKay

Not long after the Gateway Inquiry drew to a close, and only a couple of weeks after his 80th birthday. Bertie (Baginton's Independent Ward Councillor) was diagnosed with terminal cancer and given 6-12 months. Like the trouper he was, Bertie carried on with many of his Ward Councillor duties and in the meantime underwent intensive treatment sessions of various debilitating kinds. He continued with his long walks and seemed to be coping extremely well - but the cancer kept on spreading.

Eventually, he became seriously ill over the course of only a week or so, and died in Walsgrave hospital late on the evening of Thursday 5th February.

If you would like to come along to join us we meet every Thursday morning (term-time only) in the village hall from 9.30-11.30am.


