We are extremely grateful to all these agencies for their support.

Above all, our project will bring a threefold benefit to our community:

- It will improve the carbon footprint of the village
- It will enhance biodiversity in this neglected space
- It will develop greater awareness of environmental issues and of the flora of our area through families taking ownership of individual trees



We hope you have enjoyed the numerous quizzes and bingo sessions we have organised over the years. Thanks to your generosity at these events and those of individuals who have made donations, we have have been able to improve the chances of survival from sudden cardiac arrest through the provision of two new defibrillators in the village.

The older models had come to the end of their working life and have been disposed of in an environmentally friendly way. The new defibrillators, that contain the latest technology, have been placed at the Village Hall and the Malt Shovel.



Statistically 80% of all sudden cardiac arrests occur in the home. The new defibrillators are strategically located and available 24/7 for use in the village. Sudden cardiac arrest survival rates improve to 50% with delivery effective of Cardiopulmonary Resuscitation (CPR) and the use defibrillator.

A cardiac arrest usually happens without warning. If someone is in cardiac arrest, they collapse suddenly and:

- will be unconscious
- will be unresponsive and


 won't be breathing or breathing normally - not breathing normally may mean they're making gasping noises

Without immediate treatment or medical attention, the person will die. If you see someone having a cardiac arrest, phone 999 immediately and start CPR.

The Ambulance Control Room

operator will tell you the where the nearest defibrillator is located and tell you the access code to open the cabinet. You will need to send someone to fetch the defibrillator. If you are by yourself then continue to deliver CPR until help arrives.



Cherry & Cranberry Shortbread

Serves 10 10 mins to prepare and 30 mins to cook

343 calories / serving Vegetarian

Ingredients

- 250g unsalted butter
- 75g icing sugar
- 250g (8oz) plain flour
- 40g (1 1/2oz) dried cherries, roughly chopped
- 40g (1 1/2oz) dried cranberries, roughly chopped
- 1 lime, zested
- 3 tbsp caster sugar

Method

- 1. Heat the oven to gas 3, 170°C, fan 150°C. Beat the butter and icing sugar together until light and fluffy.
- 2. Sift the flour into the butter mixture and add the cherries, cranberries and lime zest. Mix with a large spoon until it all comes together as a soft dough.
- 3. Spoon into a 22cm (8 1/2in) fluted tart tin with removable base and gently press into a flat, even layer with your fingers or the back of a spoon.
- 4. Using a large knife, score into 10 wedges, prick numerous times with a fork, then bake for 25-30 minutes until lightly golden.
- 5. While the shortbread is still warm, cut it into 10 wedges, following the score marks. Dust with the caster sugar and leave to cool in the tin for approx. 30 minutes. When firm enough to remove, carefully transfer to a cooling rack. Snap along the scored lines to serve.
