

### Affordable Housing

At the Parish Council meeting in September, the Parish Council agreed in principle that as matters stood they could not accept the recommendation from Warwickshire Rural Community Council that they support the proposed Affordable Housing development.

The Chair and Clerk met with Cllr Doody and members of Warwick District Council's Housing Department on 12th September. During the meeting at WDC it was agreed that if the problem of the sewers can be sorted and also the types of property (more houses than maisonettes) then, the next step would be to proceed with a second housing needs survey. This is in response to comments from many villagers that they misunderstood the term 'affordable housing' in the original survey. This survey would be conducted by WDC, with Parish Council input and would include a glossary of terms so no-one could misunderstand the questionnaire.




# St Giles' **Bellringers**




