

The clocks have changed, the nights are drawing in and we are now looking into the winter months. Hopefully, the winter • weather will be kind to us, but you never know. Cold weather can cause all sorts of health problems when the temperature drops to below 8C. Some people are at increased risk of

- heart attack
- stroke
- pneumonia
- falls and injuries
- hypothermia
- depression
- Dementia

Very cold weather can affect anyone, but you are most vulnerable if:

- you're 65 or older
- you have a long-term health condition, such as heart, lung or kidney disease
- vou're disabled
- you're pregnant
- (newborn to school age)
- condition

your family warm and well at on keeping well. home:

- if you're not very mobile, or have a health condition. such as heart or lung disease, heat your home to at least 18C (65F)
- keep your bedroom at 18C all night if you can - and keep the bedroom window closed
- during the day you may prefer your living room to be slightly warmer than 18C
- to reduce the risk of sudden infant death syndrome (SIDS), babies

- should sleep in rooms heated to between 16C and 20C
- draw curtains at dusk and keep doors closed to block out draughts
 - Ensure you have your heating system checked regularly by a qualified professional. Fit a carbon monoxide alarm. Carbon monoxide is known as the 'silent killer' and is not something to be ignored. Julie's Christmas Recipe



Chocolate Yuletide Log

Oven Temp: 200C/fan 180C/gas 6

Ingredients:

Cake: 3 eggs, 85g golden caster sugar 85g plain flour 2tbsp cocoa powder, ½ tsp baking powder

Filling & Icing:

50g butter, 140g dark chocolate broken into pieces, 1tbsp golden syrup, 284ml double cream, 200g icing sugar,

Method

- 1. Heat oven to temp as shown above
- 2. Grease and line a 23 x 32cm Swiss roll tin with baking/greaseproof paper
- 3. Beat the eggs and the golden caster sugar together with an electric whisk until thick & creamy
- **4**. Mix the flour (less 2tbsp), cocoa powder and the baking powder together, and then sift onto the egg mixture. Fold in then pour into the prepared tin.
- **5.** Ensure the mixture is spread evenly by moving the tin from side to side. Bake for 10 mins.
- **6.** Prepare a sheet of baking paper on your work surface. Once the cake is cooked tip it gently onto the paper, peel off the lining paper, then roll the cake up from its longest edge with the paper inside. Leave to cool.
- **7**. Make the icing by melting the butter and chocolate together in a bowl over a pan of hot water (you can microwave this but be careful it doesn't burn). Remove from the heat and stir in the golden syrup and 5tbsp of the double cream. Beat in the icing sugar until smooth.
- **8**. Whisk the remaining cream until it holds its shape.
- **9.** Unravel the cake, spread on the cream, and then carefully roll up again.
- **10**. Cut a thick diagonal slice from one end of the log. Place the log onto a plate or serving board then arrange the slice on the side with the diagonal cut against the cake to make a branch.
- **11**. Spread the icing over the log but don't cover the ends. Create the tree bark effect by marking the icing with a fork. Scatter with unsifted icing sugar, then decorate with holly.


