# **Green Shoots Project update and decision required**

### Update

A small Task Force of 4-6 people from the original list of tree-planting volunteers has volunteered to do some serious weeding before the winter frosts set in. The first session took place on Monday 28<sup>th</sup> November and will be followed by more in the coming weeks. The plan is to clear the larger weeds (dock, thistle, etc.) and plant a few more saplings where there are major gaps. I have also made and installed new family name sticks to identify the plots better and encourage all families to maintain their plots.

In the spring, wild flower seeds may be sown in the space between the trees and the hedgerow and it is thus hoped that the area will eventually be more attractive and biodiverse, Also I have now researched the design and costs of installing a commemorative and informative display board.
